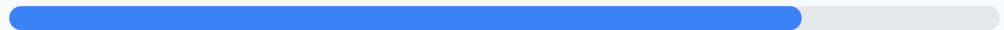

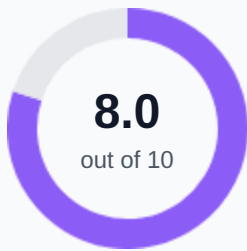


Score Distribution

Score Distribution

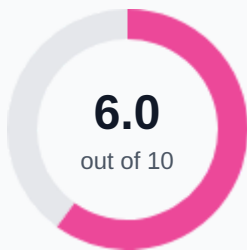


0: Numerical data contains major inconsistencies

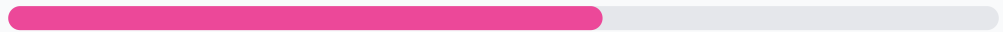

0: Claims contradict established scientific consensus

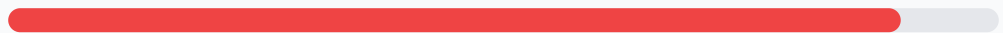
